9 Mission of Nombre de Dios Church

Explore the Nombre de Dios Mission Church. Originally constructed in the southwest corner of this Park in 1587, the Mission of Nombre de Dios Church was the first Franciscan Mission church built in the United States, and served as the hub of the entire Spanish Mission system that stretched throughout the southeast. **Open-air and always open.**

Experience Native American life as a Timucuan, one of the inhabitants of this region for thousands of years before the arrival of the Spanish. Demonstrations may include pottery making, dugout canoe construction, atlatl throwing and archery demonstrations. Gain insights into this and other Native American and European cultures. **Open-air and always open.**

15 Cannon Firing

Feel the power of a sixteenth-century six-pound fieldpiece as it bucks and roars. Pedro Menendez de Aviles brought 20 of these cannon to the fledgling settlement of St. Augustine in September of 1565. You'll feel it, smell it, hear it, and ENJOY it. **This show is open-air, and lasts roughly 10 minutes. All gunpowder-based demonstrations are weather-dependent.**

16 Spanish Watchtower

See the Menendez Settlement field from an entirely new perspective as you climb our Spanish watchtower. These sentinels of the coast were instrumental parts of St. Augustine's early warning system. Amazing views of St. Augustine's Inlet, Matanzas Bay, and North River await you! **Each Watchtower tour lasts approximately four minutes.**

13 Astillero and Chalupa

See an historically-correct chalupa (Spanish work boat). Housed in a cobertizo (boat house) whose design was taken directly from the oldest map to show the St. Augustine town plan, the chalupa shipyard is a fascinating glimpse into St. Augustine during the time of Sir Francis Drake! **Open-air and always open, in partnership with the St. Augustine Maritime Historical Foundation. Chalupa may be off-site for short periods of time.**
